# **Five Card Flickr Assignment**

Five Card Flickr didn't work in class for us today – I'm still not entirely sure why, but I think it has to do with the volume of people on the site at once. Luckily you have the WHOLE weekend to start, finish, and post this assignment for **Monday**.

#### The Assignment

Using five photos from 5-card flickr as inspiration, write a story about an important event in your life. Check out Ms. Citton's example if you're stuck.

This assignment is a one-stop shop. Once you start, you have to finish – there is no "Save and Edit Later" option.

Step 1: Find 5-Card Flickr.

- and click the first link.

Step 2: Choose Photos.

Choose five photos that make you think of an important event in your life – the time you made a school team, your favorite vacation spot, the day you became a big brother etc.

Use **F5** to refresh your pictures because if you refresh using the actual link on the top of the page, you will LOSE the photos you have already chosen. F5 saves the photos you have chosen.



Step 3: Write.

Once you have five photos, you will be able to write your story.

- Add a title
- Add your name
- Write your story in the "Comments" Section

## Step 4: Save it.


- Enter the characters and "Save My Story"
- It may take a second attempt to save if there's something missing, or if the characters are put in incorrectly.




Step 5: Post Your Story on Your Website on the EXPRESS and REFLECT page.

## **Posting Instructions:**

- 1. In a separate tab, login to your weebly and open the **Express and Reflect Page**.
- 2. Drag a "BUTTON" on to your page.





#### Final Piece:

On your weebly, under the button you just created, drag "text" on to your page.

Answer the following questions:

- What did you think of the 5-card flickr story building process? Did you enjoy it? Why/Why not?
- Did the photos help your writing process? Why/Why not?
- Why did you choose to write about that particular aspect/event in your life? How does that experience/event affect you as a person? Has it changed you? How? Why?
